
Teacher-and-Student Workshop on "Mathematical Modeling and AI"

Four grade 11 GT students and Mr. Alex O attended a teacher-andstudent workshop on "Mathematical Modeling and AI" at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (Poly U) on 18 March 2023. The organizers were the Departments of Poly U and International Math Modelling Committee (Zhong Hua).

The first session was a briefing of the International Math Modelling

Competition by Prof. Liu Yan Fiona (劉焱), Director of Cognitive Computing Lab at Poly U. As the technology of using Big Data and Mathematical Modelling with AI is rapidly developing, the International Math Modelling Competition was established in 2015 to promote this field of mathematical sciences.

The second session was held by Dr. Wu Di (武迪), a Computer Science IB teacher of **Ren Da Fu Zhong** (RDFZ, 中國人民大

Pan Pearl River Delta Elite School Physics Olympiad



The Pan Pearl River Delta and Chinese Elite Schools Physics Olympiad was established in 2005 by the HKUST Physics Department. It is held every year during the Spring Festival. More than 30 famous high schools in Hong Kong and more than 100 famous high schools in China, with a total of more than 600 gifted physics students, have participated in the competition this year.

The competition is divided into a comprehensive test and a basic test, with the former questions covering only Mechanics questions, while the latter involves the latest achievements in current science. The difficulty is close to the level of an International Physics Olympiad.

won a Second Prize in the competition on 29 Jan 2023 in HKUST. He also won a Third Prize in the competition last year. We are proud of him. Congratulations!

International Economics Olympiad Winter Challenge

Our school's Economics students have achieved remarkable success in the International Economics Olympiad Winter Challenge 2023, winning a total of 19 medals, including 2 gold medals, 7 silver medals, and 10 bronze medals out of over 1600 participants from 66 countries and regions. GT swept over 10% of the world's total medals - even better than last year's results -

MISNET: Reading Club



We were honoured to have special guests from the MISNET in the Reading Club. Professors Li and Professor Benny Hon, as well as some principals from other schools were present at the meeting. We focused on the new intelligences that Gardner has identified and is considering.

To most people, the Naturalistic Intelligence is not new. Gardner added this intelligence to his original list after being challenged by Ernst Mayer (foremost authority in the 20th Century on evolution) that there was no intelligence to explain Charles Darwin.

A second intelligence that Gardner considered is the Existential Intelligence (the intelligence of being able to deal with big questions, for example: Why do we live? Where do we come from?). In this respect philosophers and religious leaders are good examples. Existential issues arise in every culture through art, stories, and everyday life. Gardner is still considering the possibility of the Existential Intelligence. We will see how this develops. Gardner believes that teachers should approach education with an emphasis on recognizing and developing their students' multiple intelligences. This entails understanding that individuals have varied capabilities and learning styles and adapting training to each individual's needs.

During the discussion, we have shared our thoughts and experiences related to implementing Gardner's approach in our own classrooms. We talked about how we've modified our teaching tactics to better engage kids with different types of intelligence, such as using visual aids for students with high spatial intelligence or including music and movement activities for those with high bodily-kinesthetic intelligence.

Overall, Gardner's teaching theories were discussed in terms of the need of recognizing and embracing the diversity of students' abilities and learning styles, as well as the need to change instruction accordingly. Teachers may create a more inclusive and successful learning environment for all students by doing so.
