May 2023 a group of ten Grades

UK exchange trip to Invicta Grammar
School in Maidstone, Kent (South-East of
London). This year we went in May, when
spring had most definitely arrived, and the
Kent countryside was at its best. Bluebells were
prevalent everywhere.

All the students stayed with their buddies' families and emersed themselves in the UK culture, experiencing family life in the UK, and attending lessons with their buddies at school. We went to historical sites and places of interest, namely Leeds Castle, Canterbury, and Kings College (Cambridge University). We also went to Maidstone Museum and learnt about the history of the town and the surrounding area.

The oldest part of Leeds castle is over 1000 years old. However, it has been built on and improved greatly over the period including art deco rooms when the castle was used as a partying venue for the rich and famous. It is also set in the countryside, and has a large amount of land on the estate. Our students enjoyed the maze and the falconry show.

Canterbury is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, containing a cathedral where Thomas Beckett was murdered. Again the town dates back over one thousand years and the streets around the cathedral are all historic.

Kings College (Cambridge) being one of the oldest and most prestigious universities in the world was full of history and gave a full impression of life at the university.





On 20 May 2023, the Hong Kong Economic Olympiad was held by the Gifted Education Council, our school sponsoring body. Nearly 200 students from Band 1 local schools and well-known international schools participated in the competition.

The contest was divided into two parts: Economics Test and Business Case. Students were required to complete advanced-level economics questions as well as a real-life business case for a wine trading company in the Greater Bay Area.

The three professional judges were Mr. Alan Chiu, Member of the HKSAR Election Committee; Professor Arbitor Ma, Programme Leader of Economics of the Hong Kong Metropolitan University; and Mr. Yiu-man Chui, a Certified Public Accountant.

GT students won 16 gold medals and a silver medal. After the intense training and selection for the International Economics Olympiad (IEO) Hong Kong team, 2 GT students will represent Hong Kong in the IEO Main Competition in Greece. Congratulations!
