
The 4th International Multiple Intelligences (MI) Education Forum



THE 4TH INTERNATIONAL MI EDUCATION FORUM

15 - 16 DECEMBER 2025

The 4th International Multiple Intelligences (MI) Education Forum was held in Thailand on 15–16 December 2025 and hosted by Kamnoetvidya Science Academy (KVIS). The Forum attracted over 140 participants from nine regions (the U.S., Thailand, India, China, the Philippines, Malaysia, Hong Kong, Azerbaijan, Pakistan), including policy-makers, educators, and researchers. Initiated in 2021 by G.T. College of Hong Kong, the biennial event has steadily expanded its international reach and professional impact.

In the post-pandemic context, MI education has gained renewed momentum across Asia, with Thailand being recognised for its leadership in gifted education through institutions, such as KVIS and Mahidol Wittayanusorn School (MWIT). The 2025 Forum featured keynotes addressed by leading MI scholars, including Professor Howard Gardner (USA), Professor Krissanapong (Thailand), and Professor Rex Li (Hong Kong), alongside an international hybrid round-table examining the implications of artificial intelligence for MI education.

Cultural programmes highlighting Thailand's heritage were also integrated. 

4th MI Forum: MI Teachers Workshop

The MI Teachers Workshop was held on the second day of the Forum (16 December, 2025), engaging educators in re-examining teaching and learning through the framework of Multiple Intelligences (MI) Theory. Anchored by the guiding question “Why MI?”, participants explored the philosophical foundations and educational rationale of MI and its relevance to contemporary classrooms. The session illustrated the defining features of an MI classroom, highlighting how learning spaces, pedagogical strategies, and instructional resources can be intentionally designed to cultivate diverse talents.

The workshop also examined the professional qualities of an MI teacher, emphasising purposeful instructional variety, recognition of individual strengths, and sustained learner engagement. Assessment practices were discussed with a focus on moving beyond standardised testing toward authentic demonstrations of learning and competence.

The G.T. iGEM team was awarded a GOLD medal in the iGEM 2025 competition which was held from 28-31 October, 2025 at the Paris Convention Centre. The team has achieved a GOLD medal for a fourth consecutive year (2019, 2021, 2023 & 2025).

The team consists of nineteen G10 to G12 students working in a research project entitled “A Quorum Sensing Biosensor Kit for Hunting Invisible Microplastics (AQuS-HIM).” The team has successfully engineered a whole cell biosensor for the detection of microplastic pollution levels in water samples. The team also developed a standardized protocol in a testing kit which can be used in the lab to ensure data consistency for global comparison about microplastic pollution in marine waters. Besides, several outreach and education activities were conducted to create impact and momentum in the school community. The team integrated AI technology to develop a prototype of an automated microplastic collecting car for microplastic collection and education. 

Outstanding Achievements in the John Locke Institute Global Essay Prize 2025

In early October 2025, the results of the prestigious John Locke Institute Global Essay Prize were announced, and three of our 12A students achieved remarkable success on the international stage.

Marcus Chan (12A) earned a Certificate of Recognition, placing him among the world's top 18.65% for his Economics essay, which examined the implications of applying value-added tax on school fees in the UK. Christie Leung (12A) also received a Certificate of Recognition in Psychology for her thoughtful analysis of a quote by Eleanor Roosevelt, the former First Lady of the USA.

Most impressively, Emma O (12A) achieved a Very High Commendation, placing her in the top 1% worldwide. Her Law essay tackled complex questions surrounding international war crimes with clarity and depth. Their accomplishments not only highlight the intellectual talent of our students, but also their perseverance in preparing submissions under a tight schedule while balancing examination commitments.


Gratitude Education for GT (GE4GT)

Based on the findings of an individual case study and the first year of whole-school gratitude education, GT launched its Gratitude Education Programme during March-May, 2025. The research has evolved from insight-oriented inquiry to action-driven school improvement, with the aim of enhancing students' socio-emotional wellbeing and supporting long-term student achievement.



Follow-Up Gratitude Practices (January–June 2026)

A majority of G.T. students indicated in the Final Evaluation of Gratitude Education for GT (2025) that they would welcome deeper understanding and more opportunities to practise gratitude. Students reported increased conviction that gratitude has a powerful impact on strengthening reflective competence, which in turn supports personal growth, socio-emotional health, and achievement across multiple aspects of life.



Gratitude Christmas Cards (December 2025)

Format: Each student was provided with Christmas cards to express gratitude to parents, friends, teachers, or school administrators during the festive season.

Participants: Grades 7–12



Recruitment of Gratitude Ambassadors (December 2025–January 2026)



Format: A recruitment questionnaire was distributed to invite students to express their interest in gratitude practices and to serve as Gratitude Ambassadors

Participants: 24 students from Grades 7–11



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
