From 9 to 16 January 2026, nine Grade 9 students took part in an enriching journey to Kamnoetvidya Science Academy (KVIS), a prestigious science-focused secondary school in Thailand. The program offered a well-rounded blend of cultural, recreational, and academic experiences that left a lasting impression on all participants.

On the leisure front, students explored vibrant local life—shopping in Rayong and Bangkok, painting by the beach, and sampling fresh fruit at the Rayong market. They enjoyed an electric boat ride at the Nitasrattanakosin Museum in Bangkok, crafted woven gifts for their parents at the Krajoed Weaving Community Enterprise Group in Mab Lao, and tried natural cloth dyeing at the Wang Chan Reforestation Center. A visit to VISTEC and its observatory tower sparked curiosity, while a trip to the Cocoa Farm offered a fascinating look at the chocolate-making process from bean to bar.

Academically, the students embraced new challenges with enthusiasm. Whether channeling their competitive spirit in volleyball, engaging with interactive iPads and smartboards during English, biology, and chemistry lessons, or learning basic Thai greetings, they approached every activity with open minds. In art class, they designed thoughtful bread greeting cards, and in cooking, they made Bua Loy—a delicious Thai dessert of glutinous rice balls in coconut milk.

The journey was as inspiring as it was memorable, leaving students eager to return for another unforgettable experience.
