On 4 June 2026, Engineer Mr. Matthew Lee from CLP Power joined our weekly assembly in the school hall. He opened with a playful slide, "You can't see me," highlighting that electricity is invisible but powerful, and then guided us through an engaging "Power Journey".

Mr. Matthew Lee explained that supplying electricity involves much more than simply "pressing a button". Every stage—from choosing suitable fuels and technologies to running power plants and transmission networks—requires careful planning. He also discussed the power industry's response to climate change, explaining how CLP is using low-emission fuels, renewable energy, and smart city solutions to support a more sustainable future.

Students were captivated by Mr. Matthew Lee's stories about an engineer's daily work, including its challenges, humorous moments, and the importance of teamwork. He also outlined CLP's training routes, such as graduate traineeships and engineering apprenticeships, along with their academic requirements.

The session concluded with a lively Q&A. Thank you, Mr. Matthew Lee, for an inspiring and informative morning.
